














Survey Question Types

Survey questions are used for gathering information or opinion and don't have correct or incorrect answers. Survey questions can be used in both graded quizzes and surveys.

The table below lists all survey question types supported by iSpring QuizMaker.

<div><div>blocked URL</div><div>Likert Scale</div></div>	<div><p>Respondents are asked to choose a response on a Likert scale that best reflects their opinion on a statement.</p><div><table><tr><td>Statement</td><td>Add Answer</td></tr><tr><td>Statement 1</td><td>Delete Answer</td></tr><tr><td>Statement 2</td><td>Move Up</td></tr><tr><td>Statement 3</td><td>Move Down</td></tr><tr><td>Type to add a new item</td><td>Scale...</td></tr></table></div><p>You can add as many statements as you need. You may change the text of the answer choices. Click the option and edit the text. 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blocked URL Pick One	<p>A survey participant is offered to choose one option from several alternatives.</p>  <p>You can add as many choices as you need and change the text. Choices can be rearranged with the Move Up and Move Down actions in the contextual menu. A choice is marked as 'Type in', user will have an option to enter custom answer for it.</p>
blocked URL Pick Many	<p>A survey participant is offered to select one or several options from the available choices.</p>  <p>You can add as many options as you want and arrange them in the desired order. If an answer choice or multiple choices are marked as 'Type in', user will have an option to enter custom answer for them.</p>
blocked URL Short Answer	<p>A survey participant should type a short answer (one line) in the text field.</p>
blocked URL Numeric	<p>A survey participant should enter a numeric value to answer this question type.</p>
blocked URL Ranking	<p>A survey participant is prompted to rank items in preferred order.</p>  <p>You can add as many answers as you want.</p>
blocked URL Matching	<p>A survey participant is asked to match pairs of words, phrases or images.</p>  <p>Add several pairs of words, phrases or images. It's possible to add an image or an equation to the text.</p>

blocked URL Which Word	<p>A survey participant is offered to fill in the blanks in sentences with words from a word bank.</p>  <p>Type a text and replace some words with placeholders. Then add as many words to the word bank as you like.</p>
blocked URL Fill in the Blank	<p>A survey participant is asked to fill in the blanks in a given text.</p> 
blocked URL Multiple Choice Text	<p>A survey participant is asked to choose one of the options from a drop-down list.</p> 
blocked URL Essay	<p>Survey participant is asked to share his or her opinion on a given topic in a freeform response.</p>

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
