

Intro Slide

An intro or introduction slide is the first slide of your quiz. The aim of the intro is to grab your quiz takers attention and give them an overview of what's to come. Your intro slide can contain training instructions, your company profile or any other information you consider relevant. There can only be one intro slide in a quiz. It always appears on top in the list of questions.
