


Experts

While taking a course or reading through a longread, your users might have lots of questions. To allow your students to receive advice from a professional, add an expert, a person who is proficient in the subject of the course.

By default, the course expert is its author. But, if you need to, you can always [assign another person as an expert](#).

Learning tracks, however, don't have any default expert assigned. You will have to assign one manually.
