## Request: GET /content



You will retrieve a list of course that were originally uploaded to the account. Content copied from other courses won't appear in the response.

*Account Owner, Account Administrators, Department Administrators, Publishers, or users with a [custom role](#).*

## Request Headers

Header	Description
X-Auth-Account-Url (required)	The base URL of the account, e.g. <a href="http://myaccount.ispringlearn.com">http://myaccount.ispringlearn.com</a>
X-Auth-Email (required)	The <b>login</b> of <i>Account Owner, Account Administrator, Department Administrator, Publisher</i> or a user with a custom role.
X-Auth-Password (required)	The password of <i>Account Owner, Account Administrator, Department Administrator, Publisher</i> or a user with a custom role.

## Response Codes

Code	Text	Description
200	Successful operation	The request has been successfully processed. The response body contains the XML data regarding all account courses.
400	Bad Request	A request error.
401	Unauthorized	An authorization error.
403	Permission denied	The user doesn't have enough permissions to get a list of account courses.
