In iSpring Learn, you have the option to create complex online courses. A course consists of sections with modules or represents a row of various content items that are not divided in sections.

Use modules in various formats: video lectures, audio, documents, presentations, free-form assignments and tests.

Specify the due date, order, and conditions of course completion, create a certificate that your students will get after they pass it, enroll learners into the course, and track down how they are taking it with reports.
